### HOUSE RESOLUTION

*Title* **A resolution** challenging the constitutionality of any individual health care mandate passed into law by the Federal Government.

**WHEREAS**, the United States Constitution establishes a limited federal government, as expressed in the Bill of Rights, that protects the freedom of individuals and the rights of states, and

**WHEREAS**, the "individual mandate" provision included in the newly passed health care plan requires all individuals to purchase health insurance products and services, and

**WHEREAS**, such individual mandates are contrary to the rights of a free and prosperous people and deny individuals the right to make one of the most basic health care decisions for themselves and their loved ones, and

**WHEREAS**, the United States Supreme Court has recognized each individual's freedom to refuse health care treatment, NOW, THEREFORE,
